Reason for contact

Urgent consultation for dizziness and near-syncope.

History

Patient reports that earlier today she felt light-headed when standing and had a near-faint. She did not injure herself. She reports this was unsettling and requested urgent review. No prior falls in the preceding year. Baseline status independent.

Patient-reported medications: apixaban, metoprolol modified release and perindopril.

Known allergy: sulfonamide antibiotics - rash.

Examination

Irregular pulse at 44 bpm.

Investigations

ECG performed in clinic: atrial fibrillation with slow ventricular response.

Assessment

Symptomatic bradycardia in the setting of known persistent atrial fibrillation. Required emergency department assessment.

Medication changes

No changes to current medications:

- Apixaban 5 mg twice daily
- Metoprolol modified release 50 mg once daily
- Perindopril 5 mg once daily

Plan

Same-day emergency department assessment for symptomatic bradycardia. Patient advised not to drive to hospital.

Follow-up

Emergency department assessment at Logan Hospital today, 22 August 2026. Responsible party: patient. Status as of this consultation: outstanding.

Safety-netting

Advised not to drive. If symptoms worsen or she feels unwell before reaching hospital, she should seek urgent assistance.
