Practice: Browns Plains Family Practice

Encounter: Urgent consultation

Reason for contact

Two days of cough and fever.

History/background

Known hypertension, osteoarthritis and mild cognitive impairment. Lives with daughter and normally mobilises with a walking stick. Allergy: clarithromycin - severe nausea.

Primary GP: Dr Aaron Smith.

Regular medications before this visit: candesartan 8 mg once daily; paracetamol 1 g up to three times daily as required.

Examination

Temperature 38.1°C. Right basal crackles.

Assessment

Likely community-acquired pneumonia.

Plan

- Start amoxicillin/clavulanate 875/125 mg twice daily for suspected community-acquired pneumonia.
- Safety-net advice given: seek urgent care for confusion, worsening breathlessness or poor intake.
- Follow-up/escalation: outstanding - patient and family to escalate for confusion or respiratory deterioration by 31/08/2026; Logan Hospital.

Medication changes

Started:

- Amoxicillin/clavulanate 875/125 mg twice daily, active, for suspected community-acquired pneumonia.

Regular medications unchanged:

- Candesartan 8 mg once daily.
- Paracetamol 1 g up to three times daily as required.

Safety-netting

Seek urgent care for confusion, worsening breathlessness or poor intake.

Follow-up

Escalate for confusion or respiratory deterioration by 31/08/2026 (patient and family; Logan Hospital). Outstanding as of this encounter.
