Reason for contact

Review of symptom and allergy status following recent urinary tract infection and suspected antibiotic reaction.

History

Ms Rossi was treated for a urinary tract infection in late August 2026. Trimethoprim 300 mg nightly was commenced on 29 August 2026 but was ceased on 30 August 2026 after she developed a generalised urticarial rash following two doses. She attended Logan Urgent Care Centre on 30 August 2026, where a probable trimethoprim allergy was documented. Nitrofurantoin 100 mg twice daily was started as an alternative treatment for a 5-day course.

Urine culture collected on 29 August 2026 was reported final on 31 August 2026, showing an organism susceptible to nitrofurantoin and resistant to trimethoprim. This was discussed by telephone on 1 September 2026, with advice to continue nitrofurantoin and to permanently update the allergy list.

Ms Rossi completed the nitrofurantoin course on 4 September 2026, with urinary symptoms resolved.

Today's review

She reports no current urinary symptoms. No rash is present. The trimethoprim allergy is visible in the record.

Assessment

Urinary tract infection resolved. Drug reaction resolved. Trimethoprim allergy documented and verified.

Medication changes

Nil today. Nitrofurantoin course completed on 4 September 2026. Trimethoprim remains ceased.

Plan

- Trimethoprim allergy record updated and verified.
- No further antibiotics required at this time.
- Safety-netting: seek urgent care if urinary symptoms recur, or if rash, facial swelling, or breathing difficulty develops.
- Follow up with regular GP if symptoms return or if any new concerns arise.
